PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

As we reach the end of another busy and successful term, I would like to thank our students, staff and families for their ongoing support and commitment to our college community.

This term has been filled with many highlights.

House Colour Day once again brought great energy and school spirit, with students proudly representing their houses and participating in a range of activities.

Our students have also represented the college exceptionally well at various sporting events throughout the term, demonstrating teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship.

A particular highlight was seeing students attend the Melbourne NRL State of Origin game and participating in the Long Walk prior to the Dreamtime game at the 'G', providing valuable opportunities to celebrate culture, community and elite sport.

We encourage parents and carers to take the time to review the reports with their child and celebrate their efforts throughout the semester. Looking ahead, Term 3 promises to be another exciting and busy term. Our Prep to Year 4 students will participate in the swimming program, while many year levels will enjoy valuable camp experiences, including the Year 3 Camp to Lady Northcote Recreation Camp, the Year 5 Camp to Sovereign Hill, the Year 6 Melbourne City Camp and the Year 8 Snow Camp. These experiences provide students with wonderful opportunities to develop independence, teamwork and resilience outside the classroom.

Students in Years 4-9 will also have the opportunity to challenge themselves through the ICAS assessments and the Mathematics Competition. We encourage interested students to participate and showcase their academic talents.

A key date for families next term will be our Parent Teacher Interviews on Thursday 10th September. These interviews provide an important opportunity to discuss student progress and learning goals. 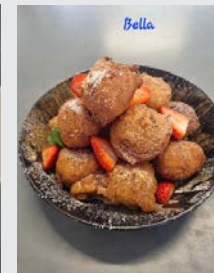
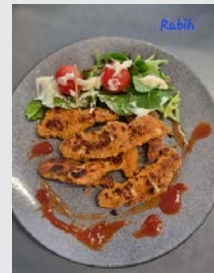


This term, our P-4 students came together for a wonderful assembly celebrating learning, achievement and our College values.

HOUSE COLOUR DAY

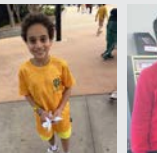
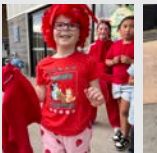


On Friday 12th June, We held our Term 2 House Colour Day!

Child Care Subsidy & Fees

Child Care Subsidy

Did you know you could pay as little as \$13.50 per session. Please note that subsidised hours are calculated and allocated by Centrelink on a fortnightly bases. Check Centrelink for eligibility.

Fees

Fees are charged two weeks in advance. You will be emailed an account statement before the direct debit is processed. This statement will show:

- The payments that will be direct debited for permanent bookings plus any casual bookings for the next two week period
- An estimation of the subsidies you may be entitled to

The amount you need to pay appears at the top-right hand side of the statement.

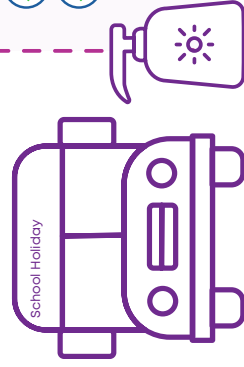
Excursions

- Please arrive and sign in by 8:30am. If you have not arrived by the bus departure time, you may need to drop your child(ren) at the excursion
- **Please** check with your program coordinator for the expected return time for pick-up. Excursions usually return after 3:00pm.

For more information, please speak with your program coordinator or visit the service website for details. Some activities may require specific items such as a change of clothes or a towel.

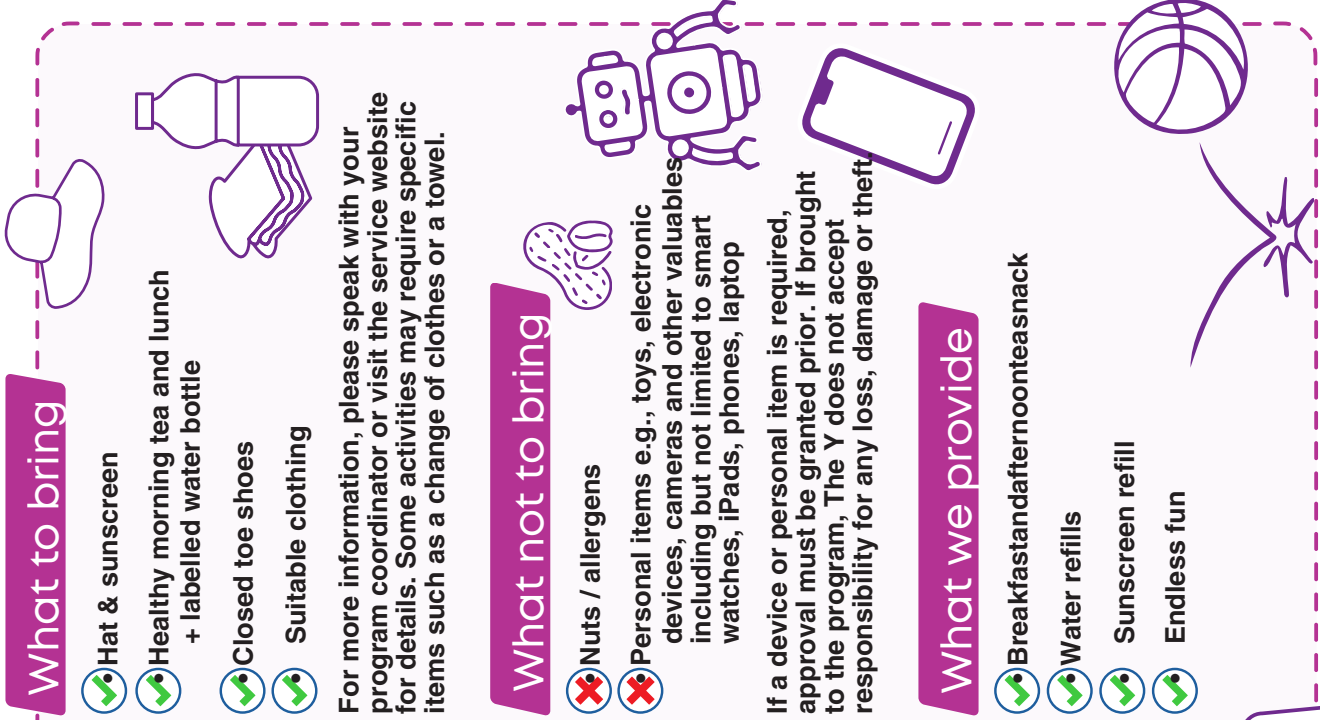
What not to bring

Medical Management Plan & Medication

All children who have been diagnosed with a medical condition will need to provide:

In the interests of child safety, care may be refused on the day should the appropriate documentation or medication not be supplied.
