



Point Cook College operates a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program for students in Years 7–9.

The program provides students with access to a personal device that can be used to support learning both at school and at home.

For 2027, families will have two ways to provide a suitable device:

1. PURCHASE THROUGH THE COLLEGE BYOD PORTAL

Point Cook College has partnered with Learning With Technologies (LWT) to provide an online purchasing portal with College-recommended devices. Recommended options include:



- **Asus Expertbook — Windows 11**
- **Apple MacBook Neo — macOS**

Purchasing through LWT is recommended, but not compulsory.

2. PURCHASE FROM ANOTHER RETAILER

Families may purchase a suitable device from any retailer of their choice.

Devices purchased elsewhere must meet or exceed the College's minimum specifications below.

3. USE AN EXISTING DEVICE

If your family already owns a suitable device, you do not need to purchase a new device. Existing devices are welcome provided they meet the College's minimum requirements and are in good working condition.

APPLE DEVICE

- MacBook running a currently supported version of macOS
- 8 GB memory minimum
- 256 GB storage minimum
- Wi-Fi connectivity
- Built-in webcam and microphone
- Physical keyboard and trackpad
- Battery capable of lasting a full school day
- For new purchases, 16 GB RAM and 512 GB storage are recommended where budget allows.
